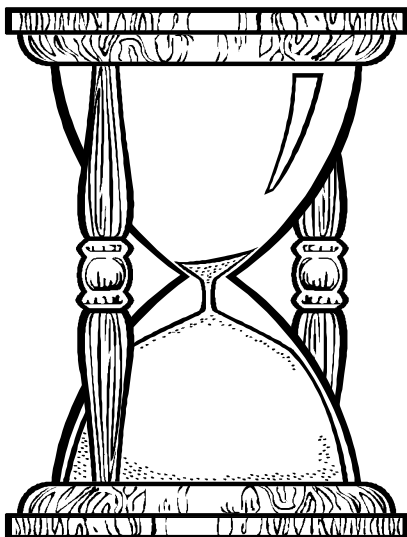

I would also like to thank all the brother Knight's that helped decorate the church and in setting up the nativity scene for Christmas. You did a fine job as always.

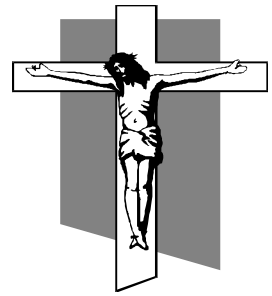

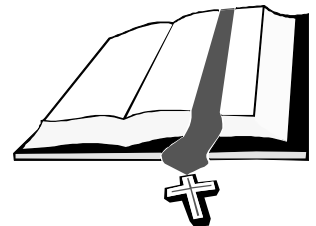

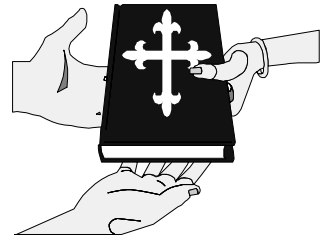
Adoration

**A MESSAGE FROM YOUR CHURCH RECORDER
& RESPECT LIFE, JUSTICE & PEACE CHAIRMAN**



As mentioned last month, here is the second Catholic Social Teaching (CST) of the U.S. Catholic Bishops.

THEME #2: CALL TO FAMILY, COMMUNITY, AND PARTICIPATION

In the act of creating man and woman and establishing their relationship with each other and with Him, God reveals our eminently communal and social nature. In the coming of Jesus Christ, we understand the Trinitarian nature of God. Jesus reveals God as Father and sends the Holy Spirit as his gift to us to dwell in our hearts and to form us into community. God's nature is communal and social; therefore our nature, created in His image, is communal and social as well.

In a global culture driven by excessive individualism, our tradition proclaims that the person is not only sacred but social. How we organize our society-in economics and politics, in law and policy-directly affects human dignity and the capacity of individuals to grow in community. The family is the central social institution that must be supported and strengthened, not undermined. While our society often exalts individualism, the Catholic tradition teaches that human beings grow and achieve fulfillment in community. Every society worthy of the name can be sure that it stands in the truth when all of its members, thanks to their ability to know what is good, are able to pursue it for themselves and for others. It is out of love for one's own good and for that of others that people come together in stable groups with the purpose of attaining a common good. We believe people have a right and a duty to participate in society, seeking together the common good and well-being of all, especially the poor and vulnerable. Our Church teaches that the role of government and other institutions is to protect human life and dignity and promote the common good.

I often write about recruiting a new member, which you should be working on for your council, but I never mention anything about retention which is very important. Imagine you're trying to fill a bucket of water. Every drop you put in should increase its contents, but if there's a leak then you may end up losing more water than you gain. Think of the membership in our council in the same way - every new Brother Knight we add won't help our membership increase and grow if we lose existing members. The growth of the Knights of Columbus depends not only on recruiting new members, but also on retaining current ones. The retention effort for the new member begins once he joins the order. Addition efforts must be made to retain long standing members and to keep them enthusiastic about the order. This is where you as that member sponsors help guide him into being there when he takes his Degrees. I have been to many Degrees in which the sponsor never even makes an effort to support him by attending that Degree with him.

The next 1st Degree will be held on Monday January 20, 2014 at Fr. Kass Council Hall, 8410 Kass Drive in Buena Park and the next 2nd Degree will be at the same location. The date for that 2nd Degree is Sunday January 26, 2014 and the check-in time is 1:00 PM. I do not have the date for the next 3rd Degree at this time.

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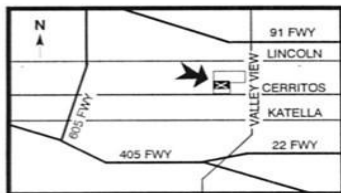

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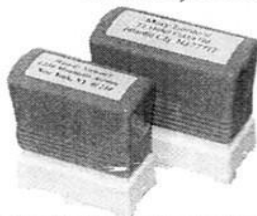
