May God richly bless you and your families.

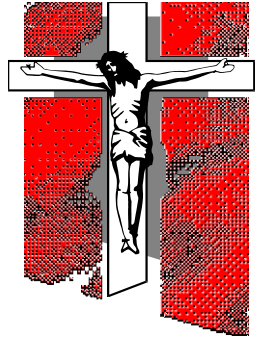

An Attitude of Gratitude

There is a story in *Luke 17:11-19* about Jesus passing through Jerusalem. In the midst of Samaria and Galilee he entered a village where He saw ten men who were standing a distance away. They all started shouting “Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!” Jesus saw that they were lepers and He told them, “Go show yourself to the priests.” When they did this they were cleansed. One of the ten (a Samaritan) came back when he realized Jesus had healed him and loudly proclaimed his thankfulness to God. He fell down at Jesus feet and gave Him thanks and praise. Jesus asked him “were there not ten of you who were cleansed? 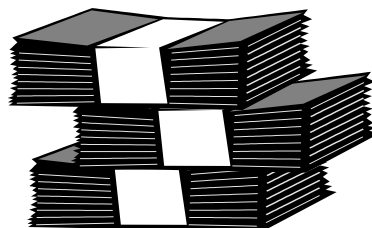

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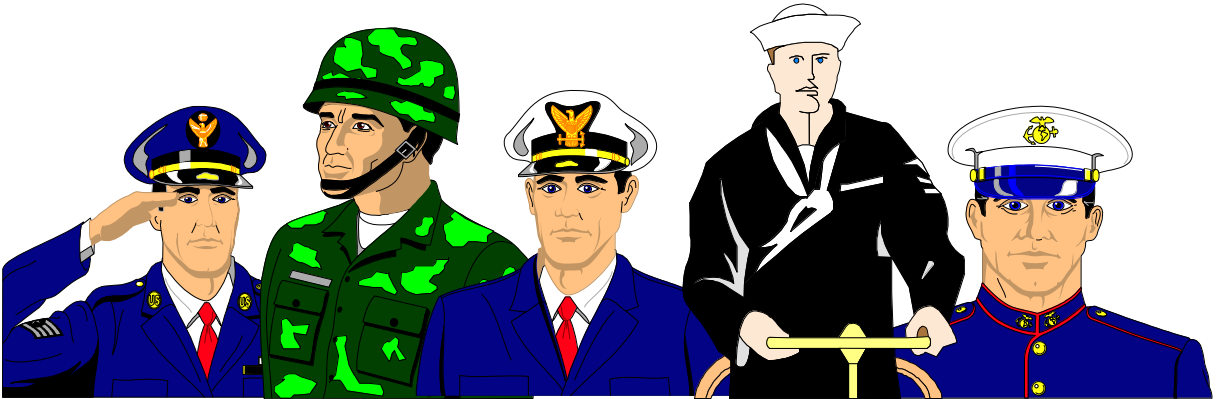

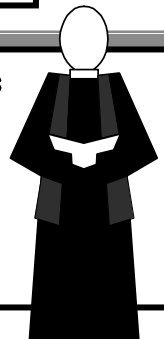

Life Center of Santa Ana

Come Holy Spirit! Although the **Life Center of Santa Ana**, a non-profit pregnancy resource center, is approaching its 50th anniversary year of supporting pregnant and parenting women, the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops' initiative, *Walking With Moms* (March, 2020), breathed a beautiful spark of new life into the ministry of the Life Center.

Recognizing that even though a “turnabout” at Planned Parenthood brings great relief in that a baby has been saved, there’s no way of knowing what kind of emotional support that abortion-minded mother has at home, whether or not she knows God, or if she plans to return to the abortion clinic the next day.

As a result of the *Walking With Moms* initiative, the Life Center has begun inviting the pregnant mothers whom they serve to be matched with mentors from the parishes within the Diocese. By matching a mother in crisis with a mentor who is rooted in her faith and the sacraments, we can provide greater emotional support to our clients.

With an average of 125 clients per month, fifty of them who are currently pregnant, our Life Center team is not large enough for us to regularly reach out and support our mothers. Recognizing that our world is pulling mothers to abort their babies, we need women from our parishes to help us in ending the culture of death.

Our mentors regularly reach out to our mothers, either via text, phone call or with an in person meeting at the Life Center, to provide that much needed emotional support and encouragement. Additionally, our mentors bridge the gap between the clients of the Life Center and the Catholic parishes in the community, planting seeds of faith in their walk with the mothers.

The mentors from the different parishes are able to share the events that their churches are offering, and then those events can be shared with our mothers. In August, one of our churches hosted a family picnic. It was wonderful to see several of our mothers there with their children. To invite our Catholic communities to love our mothers like the Good Samaritan in the Gospel of Luke is a great, big step in ending the culture of death. The more we can invite our parishes into relationships with pregnant and parenting mothers in need, the more we can build the Kingdom of God.

Another parish is hosting a baby shower at their church for thirty of our mothers. In inviting our mother’s home to the church, we are taking a much needed step in transforming their hearts.

Our prayer is always, Lord, please help us to build relationships with abortion-minded women and transform their fear into an eternal spring of hope. Not only do we want to save the unborn babies, we want to save their mothers, bringing them home to a relationship with Jesus Christ and His Church communities.

With the Life Center offering free pregnancy testing, we realize that God was literally delivering abortion-minded women right to us. When a pregnant teenage girl comes out of the restroom with a positive pregnancy test in her hand, we know the Holy Spirit is calling us to love on her all the more and point the way to Christ. Our team wraps her in a prayer shawl and offers the hope and encouragement she needs to believe in herself and God's plan for her. We then need to get her matched with a mentor because even though she may leave the center saying that she's going to keep her baby, she needs daily support and encouragement or she may end up at Planned Parenthood aborting her baby.

If that teenage girl tests negative for pregnancy, we can't give her a wave goodbye and say, "See you the next time you may be pregnant." She too needs a mentor who is going to walk with her and share God's truth with her in love.

Many women in our community are struggling emotionally and/or financially and do not realize the support and resources that are available to them. And, many parents of pregnant teenagers are telling their pregnant daughters that the family can't afford a baby and that she needs to abort. And then there's the "shame factor" with parents feeling ashamed that their teen daughter is pregnant, they tell the daughter that she can no longer be seen at church. The very things that mothers-in-crisis need the most: God, love, and community, are the very things of which they are being deprived.

In our volunteering at the Life Center, our team wears aprons because we believe the apron is a symbol of our servant hearts. We want the bright and joyful aprons to be the first thing that our mothers see when they walk in the front door and that we are there to serve them. We know that perfect love casts out all fear (1 John 4:18). With an apron of hospitality, and the perfect love of our team and mentors, and the power of the Holy Spirit, we can help cast out the fear of an abortion-minded woman and help her choose life.

The Catholic identity of our Life Center is obvious to all who enter and the relationships that our team is building with our parishes are lifesaving. We recently had a mother of seven come into the center who asked if she could take home the Holy Water that was on our prayer altar because she wanted to bless her children. We learned that none of her children had been Baptized because she did not think she could afford to pay the Baptismal fees required by the church. After a phone call to a local Catholic Church, and the Baptismal donation waived, the mother is working with the church to prepare the children for Baptism.

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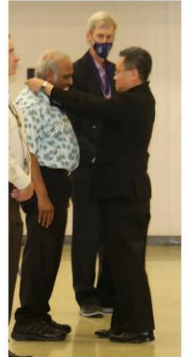

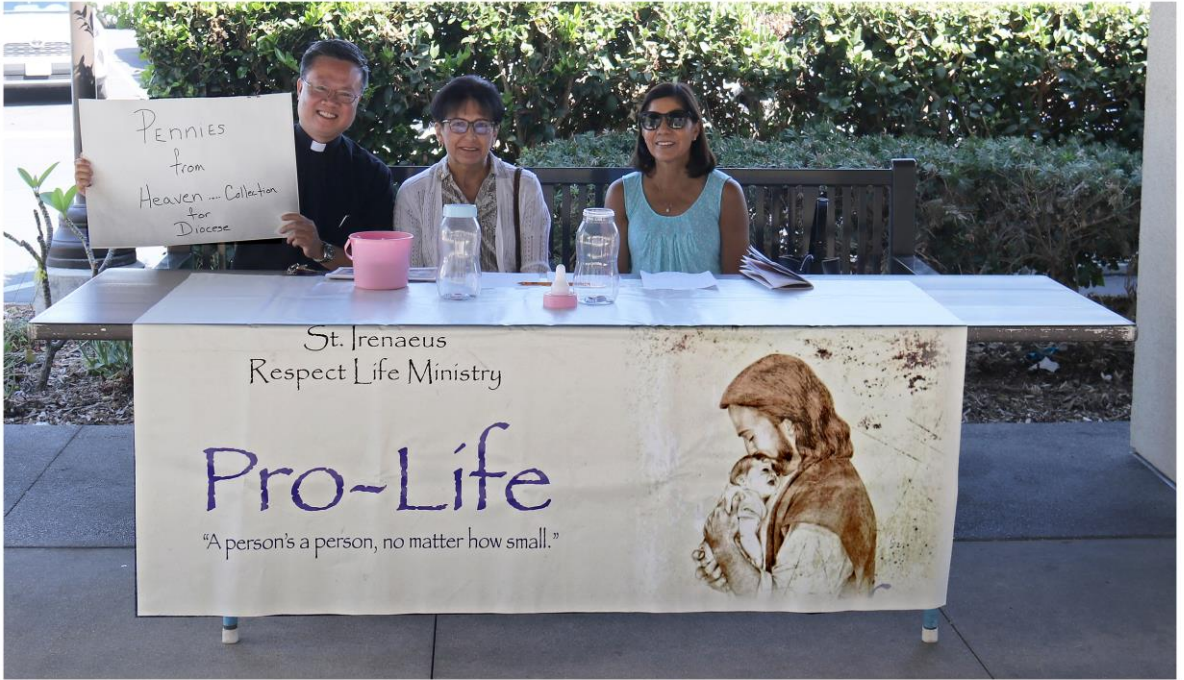
