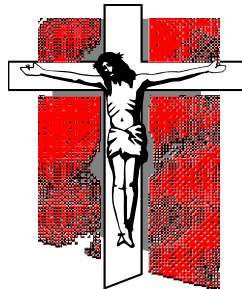

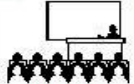

PENTECOST AT DISNEYLAND

Our first ride was called Soarin' Over California. Our fast passes made the wait time short. Disney used the latest photography to allow guests to be lifted into the air in airplane seats to soar as if flying to tour the entire world in the first film of Soarin'. The ride this day was a tour of all of California. While inching forward toward the ride, areas in California were named that we would be viewing. It was magnificent as we flew over the scenes and were lifted up to the next part of California! I wondered what God thinks of this beautiful creation that He called "Good" when He created it!

At 1:26 pm we stopped at a Starbucks for delicious coffee treats. Inside a small table was set up with small military flags, a flower, and eating utensils. A small framed letter explained its purpose, "Today We Honor The Fallen Hero," a tribute for Memorial Day.

By 1:37 pm we took a short cut through the amazing Disney's Grand California Hotel & Spay. Walking past the luxurious leather chairs, where one guy was taking a snooze, we spied a tribute celebrating 100 years of Winnie the Pooh. At 2:27 pm we entered the building on Main Street that housed the first Animatronics display of Abraham Lincoln. In the lobby we watched the story of Walt Disney's admiration of Mr. Lincoln and his personal hand in bringing the figure to Disneyland in 1965. Sadly, the newly created animatronics figure of Walt Disney himself wasn't available.

A film told the fascinating story of Mr. Lincoln's vision of the hand of God bringing our country through the Civil War. We also learned of Frederick Douglas who traded his food as a youth to gain an education. Some of the film was narrated by a direct relative of Mr. Douglas. Douglas befriended President Lincoln and brought him from being simply anti-slavery to pushing through the Emancipation Proclamation. Was the Holy Spirit helping the whole process I wondered?

Next we entered the enormous theatre to see Mr. Lincoln rise from his chair and tell his story through the voice of a noted actor. Upon leaving we walked past the actual green wooden park bench from Griffith Park Merry-Go-Round in Los Angeles "where Walt Disney first dreamed of Disneyland."

At 3:10 pm we walked past a building on Main Street that was a tribute to the Sherman brothers who composed hundreds of hit toons, including "It's A Small World." At 3:17 pm Renee and Andrew dropped Julie and me off at Autopia, where I drove us in a small yellow Honda car. 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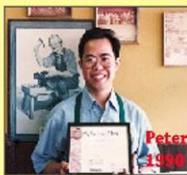


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
